#### PROVIDING PROGRAMS THAT WORK

The Jonathan D. Rosen Family Foundation developed the Wealthy Habits program in 2012 to educate students ages 11-19 about personal finance. Through the years, the organization has grown its programs and its impact. So far...

**5812** students were provided the tools necessary to make better financial decisions

**301** programs facilitated throughout the southeast

61,344 instructional hours provided to students

**261** students awarded a \$50 deposit into an investment account

#### 2018 Highlights:

- Facilitated a total of 80 programs with 42 of those programs being 5-day camps
- Development of additional subject focused camp options to encourage returning students
- A total of 10,768 instructional hours were delivered to students

To empower children and adults across the socioeconomic spectrum with the knowledge and skills essential for successful financial decision making.










Ms. Miller graduates with her BS in Finance in December of 2018 and will be joining our team next year as the Program Coordinator.
